He is the founding director of ReImagined: A Center for Integral Christian Practice, where he leads an annual series of retreats, workshops and projects designed to help participants apply spiritual wisdom to everyday life. His multidisciplinary studies in applied psychology, family health and theology have shaped his approach to learning and transformation.

This will be an excellent day for individuals – including ministers, pastors, ministry leaders and key volunteers – and leadership teams with a commitment to ministry with people of any age.


Mark Scandrette


Thriving Intergenerational Community
